- Julie led the welcome and introductions
- Budget/Match & Staff Report

The Budget and staff report were reviewed. The Match goal of \$125,000 has not been reached yet. There is still \$13,000 that is left to collect. Volunteers can do e-learning, take webinars, put up posters to earn match credit. Peder moved to approve the report, Jen seconded.

- SAM Webinar-Julie, Megan & Katie elaborate on trainings
 Julie summarized the training put on by Smart Approaches to Marijuana (SAM).
 There were details about how Big Tobacco is making money off of addiction. In states where it is legal, youth use and addiction rates go up. Marketing strategies target youth. Julie noted that there are no SAM affiliates in Wisconsin and we should consider becoming one. It was agreed that a meeting with SAM would be set up to discuss.

Jen provided information that the Brodhead School District will be starting the year with Face to Face education on Sept 2nd. Chief Hughes is in ongoing discussions with the District to monitor and review the situation and revise as warranted.
